# INFORMATION FOR APPLICANTS

## The Tau Beta Pi Scholarship Program

The administration of these scholarships has been kept as free of restriction as possible, in order to accommodate students. However, because Tau Beta Pi is the engineering honor society, recipients are expected ultimately to advance the interest of the engineering profession. Only members of Tau Beta Pi are eligible to apply. If your initiation will be reported to Headquarters by March 21 you are eligible to apply. Awards are not renewable and will be made to members **only for their senior year of full-time undergraduate engineering study during 2005-06**. Members of the Selection Board are:

## The Scholarships

The -Nagel Scholarship was established in 1998 in honor of former Secretary-Treasurer Emeritus R.H. Nagel. Named Editor of THE BENT in 1942, he became Secretary-Treasurer and Editor in August 1947 and served until October 1982 when he was named Secretary-Treasurer Emeritus. He died in 1997. The designation of *Nagel Scholar* is given to Scholars who, in the opinion of the Selection Board, are most outstanding.

The -Dodson Scholarship is named for Charles R. Dodson, Maryland Beta '30, who made a gift in 1998 sufficient to endow awards intended particularly for members of Maryland Beta. He served on the Trust Advisory Committee during 1965-85, the last 12 years as Chair.

The -Stabile Scholarship was established in 1999 by Vincent A. Stabile, New York Lambda '40, who endowed a permanent award.

The -Alabama Power Scholarship was endowed by a gift from the Alabama Power Foundation in 1995.

The -Soderberg Scholarship is named for Elsa and Peter Soderberg, Connecticut Alpha '68, who gave their first award in 1998.

The -Record Scholarships are named in honor of Leroy E. Record, Kansas Alpha '29, who left half of his substantial estate and two unitrusts to the Society. He expected that consideration be given to economic need and academic commitment.

The -Campbell Scholarships are named for Ruth M. and Cleveland L. Campbell, Iowa Alpha '47. Consideration is given to demonstrated community service and high ethical standards.

The Distinguished Alumnus Scholarship was established in 2002 to honor individually by name each Tau Beta Pi Distinguished Alumnus.

The -Scribner Scholarship was established in 2003 in honor of A.C. Scribner, New York Gamma '29, who left a significant bequest to the Society.

The -Mentor Scholarship was established in 2003 in honor of "Te Ram Bi Ta Zo" who helped and influenced the donor, a member of Missouri Beta.

Other named awards are sponsored from time to time by various individuals and corporations, such as Duke, Fluor, and GM.

## Basis of Awards

In determining to whom the scholarships shall be given, the Board is guided by the practical consideration that they go to those who really deserve them. But, in any case, it looks for high scholarship, strong faculty recommendations, definite extracurricular contributions, unusual promise of substantial achievement through a definite plan or purpose, and a program through which accomplishment will advance the interest of the engineering profession. The Board will use the principles outlined in the Eligibility Code of Tau Beta Pi as a basis for selection of the Nagel Scholars. The applicant should seek guidance from The Eligibility Code found on page iv of *The Constitution and Bylaws and Eligibility Code of The Tau Beta Pi Association, Inc.* The Fellowship Board has the sole authority to select those Scholars to receive an award. The Director of Fellowships in consultation with the Executive Director is empowered to arbitrate and apply the applicable rules that govern the program.

## Amount of Awards

Each award is cash in the amount of \$2,000 payable in two increments in September and in January. As many as 40 scholarships may be given.

## Who is eligible

Applications are welcomed from undergraduate members of Tau Beta Pi. Applicants must be planning to return to school for a two-semester or three-quarter senior year of full-time study in engineering in 2005-06. No scholarship will be awarded to any applicant who is not a member of Tau Beta Pi on the date the selections are made. If an award is made because of inaccuracy on the application, the award will be revoked when the error is discovered.

## Last Date for Filing

Application must be postmarked on or before March 1, 2005—the earlier, the better; use regular first-class mail, not special delivery, even if mailed on March 1.

Awards will be announced about April 8. Notification by email will be sent to all other applicants shortly thereafter.
